THE PREPARATION OF THE HOLY RELICS

The Celebrant Hierarch arrives at the Church to be consecrated and is received by the clergy in the Portico. After the petitions, the Hierarch reads the following prayers.

THE FIRST PRAYER BY PATRIARCH KALLISTOS HIERARCH

Lord our God, you created all things by your word alone and adorned your creation with diversity in ways unknown to us. You poured forth the light of the sun for its renewal. Lord, by your Son, you have commanded us to renew our nature by your Holy Spirit, and through this gift your just people shine like the sun. We pray and entreat you, Father of the Word, our Lord and our God Jesus Christ, because creation has been renewed by your indescribable love and abundant mercy for us. You manifested your love and mercy in the Old Testament as the image of the New, the miraculous burning bush, the tabernacle of assembly and the beautiful Temple of Solomon. Lord look upon us also, your sinful and unworthy servants with merciful eyes, who worship in this holy house, which is as broad as heaven, the pride of the universe, the true altar of your ineffable glory. Send down on us your most Holy Spirit and in the words of David, "renew a right spirit within our hearts and make us strong with your sovereign spirit." Make the leaders of our nation victorious over visible and invisible enemies and grant us tranquility and peace. Forgive the sins of those who have worked with diligence and love for you toward the erection and consecration of this Church. Fulfill Lord, all their requests which are for their salvation. Help them to perform your commandments. Give them the gift of renewal through your Holy Spirit, that they, without condemnation, may worship you, the only true God and Jesus Christ whom you sent, through the prayers of the most Holy Mother of God and all your Saints. (Amen.)

PRAYER OF PATRIARCH KALLISTOS

His Eminence Metropolitan Isaiah brings the relics of the three holy Martyrs to the Church on the eve of the Consecration. These relics will be deposited in the Altar Table the next day. The Clergy will escort the His Eminence and proceed to the Altar. His Eminence places the holy relics on the paten, covers them with a communion veil and says:

You are our Father, although Abraham did not know us, and Israel did not acknowledge us; but You, O Lord, are our Father. You delivered us, and from the beginning Your name was upon us. Why have you led us astray, O Lord, from Your path, and hardened our hearts so as not to fear You? Return for the sake of Your servants, for the sake of the tribes of Your inheritance, that we may inherit a small portion of Your holy mountain. READER

Thus says the Lord: 'I remember your compassion and youth and your love and maturity, so as to follow the Holy One of Israel,' says the Lord. 'Israel, the beginning of His harvest, was holy to the Lord. All who devour him shall transgress, and evils will come upon them,' " says the Lord. Hear the word of the Lord, O house of Jacob, and all families of the house of Israel. Thus says the Lord: "What transgression have your fathers found in Me, so as to go far from Me, to follow after vain and worthless things? They did not say, 'Where is the Lord, who led us out of the land of Egypt, who guided us in the wilderness, in an unknown and untrodden land, a land that was waterless and barren, in which no one traversed and where no son of man dwelt?' I brought you into Carmel to eat its fruit and its good things, but you entered and defiled My land, and made My heritage an abomination. The priests did not say, 'Where is the Lord?' But those who handle the law did not trust Me, and the shepherds acted profanely toward Me. The prophets prophesied by Baal and walked after unprofitable things. Therefore I will yet bring charges against you," says the Lord, "and I will bring charges against the sons of your sons. For pass by the islands of Chettim and see. Send to Kedar and consider diligently. See if such things happened, whether nations will change their gods; though they are not gods. But My people changed their glory to a glory from which they will not profit. Heaven was amazed at this and was exceedingly horrorstruck," says the Lord.
